## Fighting Blight — What is Blight?

Bight is a condition that poses a threat to the health, safety, and general welfare of a neighborhood. It can be easy to spot in things like broken doors and windows, a porch that is falling down, high weeds, and trash and litter. In some cases it may be harder to see, with a building that has interior water damage, has no utilities, or has been vandalized. Reasons for blight may vary, but one thing is certain, blight is a serious problem. Blighted properties have found a way to creep into every type of community, affluent or not.

#### What Can We Do?

Working together, we can make a difference. Property owners, neighbors, police officers, code enforcement officers, the fire department, EMT's, and animal control officers can identify problems and attack blight before it spreads. Tell your friends and neighbors about the "Fight on Blight". If you see a problem that needs attention, call or email the property address to our Code Enforcement Officers.

## A Few Examples of Violations That a Citation May Be Issued For:

Open burning violations, accumulation of trash, storing vehicles illegally, failing to clean up pet waste, failing to cut grass and weeds, broken windows, unsecured properties, etc. Visit the borough's website for a complete listing of all property maintenance and zoning ordinances (www.beaverpa.us).

#### Blight is Harmful Because it Can:

Decrease property values, discourage community investment, and reduce the quality of life in our borough. Ridding a town of blight is important to everyone because if you live within 500 feet of a blighted property, your property value declines by 5 to 15 percent.

Code Enforcement officers Rick Sprecker and George Lindemann are visiting all properties in the borough to identify code violations and working with residents to correct the violations.

## **Beaver County's Swift911** Notification System

wift911 is a high-speed **Emergency Notification** System that alerts residents to emergency situations like severe storm warnings, evacuations and more in the local area. The program has the capability of delivering messages to the entire County via telephone, cell phone, email, text message and social media sites. Some phone numbers are not in the system and residents are encouraged to update their information and contact



preferences, or add phone numbers, cell phones and email addresses.

To register your information go to beavercountypa.gov and click on the SWIFT 911 banner on the right-hand side. You can also text "SWIFT911" to 99538 to customize your information.

Registering through the Swift911 web portal ensures that residents have access to the most immediate notice of an emergency in their area.

## **Our Community Forest** If Beaver's trees could talk....

They would say ... that water and mulch are young trees' best friends. Beaver's young trees, planted within the past two years, require 2 to 3 inches of wood or other organic mulch to retain moisture and, as it decomposes, provide nutrients to the soil. Mulch should never be placed up against the tree's trunk and far enough away from the trunk to be able to see the tree's root flare. Young trees will not survive without sufficient water. A slow, thorough watering is required especially with temperatures in the 80's or if a week goes by without adequate rainfall. During drought periods, the slow, thorough watering twice a week is necessary to reach all of the roots. Taking care of our young trees now will benefit our Community Forest in future years with fresh, clean air by filtering out a variety of pollutants, providing habitats for birds and squirrels and a neighborhood forest where we can all experience shade, beauty, peace and quiet.

They would say ... that Beaver's Spring and Fall Tree Planting Program is a great way to extend our Community Forest beyond its present canopy. The program is

coordinated by our Shade Tree Commission and is available to Beaver residents to add trees or replace trees that are declining due to maturity or hazard conditions. To take advantage of this program and significant savings on tree planting costs, contact J. Philip Colavincenzo, Chairman of the Shade Tree Commission, at jp.cola@verizon.net.

They would say ... that Beaver's trees love to be part of a special tribute to honor or memorialize someone by their family or friends. Walking through Beaver's parks and along Beaver's streets, you can read the many bronze plaques placed next to trees designated to honor or memorialize that special someone. New trees can be ordered through the Spring and Fall Tree Planting Program and bronze plagues, with wording chosen by family or friends, are handled by the Shade Tree Commission. 
## Council Approves Bid for Milling and **Repaving this Fall**
