Background of the Project

- 1933: Borough pool originally constructed and opened.
- 2010-2011: The first facility conditions assessment and feasibility study was done.
- 2011: An updated pool plan was developed as part of the 2010-2011 feasibility study. The cost projection for the pool back then was \$1,384,000.
- 2020: In the early spring, an on-site pool condition re-assessment was done. The pool condition was considered too degraded to be reopened for the season. The pool was closed in 2020 because of its structural integrity.
- 2020: Late summer, community survey, with 812 completed replies,72% used the Pool in the past 3 years, and 78% chose the Pool as the most appealing feature in the park.



Current Condition

- 1. Pool condition
 - a. Lost structural integrity; fissures and soft/porous concrete
 - b. Years of patch on top of patch
- 2. Bathhouse condition
 - a. Foundation cracks
 - b. Not compliant with current accessibility requirement and building code
 - c. Dated interior finish and other floor plan inefficiency
- 3. Site condition
 - a. Drop-off issue
 - b. Limited parking space
 - c. Lacking accessible access













Current Condition

Main pool base water leak issue

With a surface area of 11,600 sqft., the pool holds 350,000 gal. of water. During operating season, a normal daily replenishment of water should be around 2,000 gal. per day to compensate for water loss due to evaporation and splash. For the past decade, the pool needs to add 12,000 gal. per day due to leaking, which was at least 10,000 gal. per day of water loss through the basin.











02 Shaw Park Design Schemes



Public Survey

812 people took the Community Recreation Survey over a 21-day period. 60% of the respondents are from the Borough (489); 34% are from the School District (277); and 6% are from outside the School District (46). Shaw Park

In ranking the ideal improvement in the park, the top 6 (in order of priority) are:

- Improved playground
- **Outdoor fireplace**
- **Casual seating**
- Rentable event space
- **Gathering area**
- **Outdoor fireplace**

Borough Pool

In ranking the most desirable new features in the pool, the top 6 (in order of priority) are:

- Shaded area
- Wading pool
- Spray pad
- Beach/zero entry
- Lawn area
- A larger water slide




