# Municipal Authority – Reported by Mr. Deelo

- August 20, 2025 Meeting Minutes and August 2025 Engineer report included in the Council packet.
- Reviewed EPA initiative, "Get the Lead Out," aimed to eliminate all lead water lines in the community within 10 years.
  - Inventory of about 2,000 customers was created to determine if they have lead water lines.
  - A letter was sent to homeowners about a year ago, but the criteria was vague, resulting in many "unknown" responses.
  - The criteria has since been revised, reducing the number of "unknown" letters to a couple hundred.
  - Meetings are being held with officials to seek funding for lead line replacement.
  - o The EPA website has a fact sheet and details about the initiative.

# Pool Committee - Reported by Mr. Andres

- September 8, 2025 meeting minutes were included in the Council packet.
- Trivia Night is planned for November 15<sup>th</sup> at the pool house. More information is available on the Shaw Park Project's Facebook page.
- Flyers and door hangers have been distributed. A future site location signage is being planned. These items are funded through fundraising efforts.

# **Council Committee Reports**

#### Finance -

- Reported by Mr. Hindman
  - Reviewed 2025 Budget status.
  - Pension numbers are higher than budgeted.
  - o Property taxes received are down due to reassessment appeals.
  - Police overtime is expected to come in at or under budget after reimbursements are considered.
  - o The year is expected to end within budget and with a transfer to the capital fund.
- Reported by Ms. Stettler
  - General review of first draft of 2026 budget.
  - o Reviewed goal to continue building back capital fund and FNB loan repayment.
  - o Highway income reduced due to Columbia Gas projects winding down.
  - Reviewed maintenance needs to Borough building, various equipment needs, and streetscape improvements.
  - Budgeting for priority needs in case grants are not received.
  - o Rising costs for supplies, materials, and healthcare factored in based on economic forecasting.
  - Budgeting for playground upgrade
- General discussion
  - Ms. McKean suggested regionalizing police services, raising rates for Vanport and Industry, and conducting a financial analysis of regionalizing the police force.
  - Mr. Andres addressed concerns of the police overtime and suggested a summarized version of the budget.

### **General Government -**

- Ms. Good thanked the Borough Road Department for their help with the Heritage Foundation's Beaver Tales event. Ms. Good stated that the employees always go above and beyond for the community.
- Mr. Andres asked when leaf pickup will begin.
  - Mr. Madgar stated that residents can start placing small piles of leaves out. Due to the weather, leaf pickup is likely to begin earlier this year.
